COUSE OBJECTIVES: This course is the second of a two-part course examining the theory and application of financial accounting. Students will::

- Demonstrate knowledge of the accounting cycle and the study of asset recording including bonds, pensions, leases and investment accounting through homework exercises and exams.
- Apply course topics through the completion of a class project.
- Demonstrate an increase in the understanding of course topics by an increase in pre and post-test scores.
